


He explained:


- Books that aren't in perfect condition have limited, if any, value.
- The paperback and hardcover were issued simultaneously from the same sheets (one print run);
 500 hardbacks and 5,150 paperbacks were published. Three hundred of those hardbacks went to libraries. (Which means they were stamped and read over and over again, thus ruining them as per the "perfect condition" metric.) The hardcover was not issued with a jacket.
